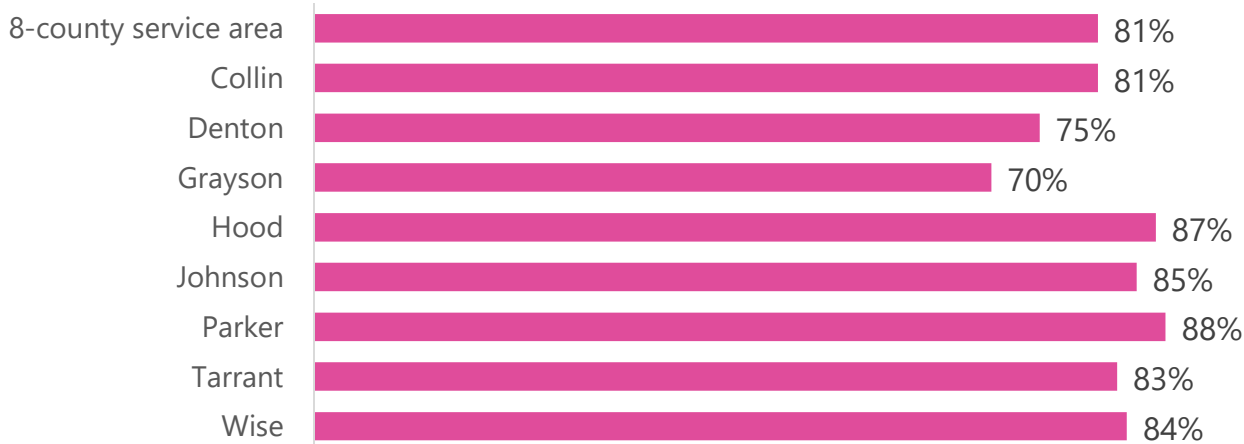

*Adverse Childhood Experiences are traumatic events that happen to children and are linked with changes in brain regulation cause by chronic stress. Data analysis prepared by Child Health Evaluation within the Cook Children's Center for Community Health, September 2025. Our 2024 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) Parent/Caregiver Survey is an annual survey given to parents/caregivers with children (ages 0-17) within Collin, Denton, Grayson, Hood, Johnson, Parker, Tarrant and Wise counties. The weighted results from 6,877 parents/caregivers provide a representative assessment of parent perception and health characteristics of children across the eight-county region. Survey responses above are from caregivers of children across our service area, not only Cook Children's patients from 2022-2024.
