Also, leads legislative committee for the Children's Oral Health Coalition, created medical/dental integration project with the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry Foundation and oral health integration in Hematology/Oncology at Cook Children's Medical Center. Serves on Board of Trustees for Texas Health Institute and a member of countless dental, civic and professional business organizations.
